

By Law No. XXV

To afford aid to build a Bridge

Whereas this Council has been petitioned by
Reud Bussitt and certain other freeholders of this
Township to afford some pecuniary aid to construct
a Bridge near Hicks Mills on what is usually called
the Coall Road

I Be it therefore ordained and enacted that there
be granted from any unappropriated monies in the hands
of the Township Treasurer, the sum of Twelve pounds ten
shillings, to aid in the construction of a Bridge near Hicks
Mills on what is usually called the Coall Road, and
that George Bissell, Jacob thHick and John Johnson be
and are hereby appointed Commissioners for the judicious
expenditure of the same in building the said Bridge.

II It is further ordained and enacted that
the above named Commissioners shall see that the said sum
is properly and economically and judiciously applied
for the objects contemplated in the grant of the said sum,
and that they render to this Council a certified account
of the proper expenditure of the same within one month after
the said sum has been so expended and appropriated.

III Be it further ordained and enacted that the Treasurer
is hereby authorized and required to advance the said sum of
Twelve pounds ten shillings from unappropriated funds in his
hands, on an order signed by the Township Clerk and counter-
signed by the Town Reeve. Passed in open Council the
Eighteenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand &
Eight hundred and fifty one
