

By-Law No. 246.

To establish a certain Road therein described

Whereas Edward B Birks Surveyor of Highways in the Township of Augusta has been petitioned by twelve Freeholders of the said Township to survey and lay out a certain Road, and whereas the said Edward B Birks has surveyed and laid out the said Road and made his report thereon, and that the said Road is surveyed and described as follows, that is to say, commencing on the west side of the east half of the west half of Lot Number two in front of the residue enclosures of the said Township, thence running back parallel with the side line six chains, thence running nearly north six chains, thence running north easterly across the remaining part of Lot Number two and the whole of Lot Number one to the Town line between Augusta and Edwardsburg thirty five chains and seventy links, and the said road is laid out thirty three feet in width and marked out by posts planted in the open ground and due public notice of the said survey has been given in three of the most public places next adjacent to the place where the aforesaid survey has been made

Be it therefore ordained and enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of Augusta assembled at the Town Hall, that the said Road as surveyed and above described shall be and is hereby confirmed and established as a public Highway or Road
